Scope of Work:

The Contractor shall install new or repair existing sidewalks and curbing as well as install new wheelchair ramps at locations and to the limits as directed by the Director of Public Services or his designee.

Qualifications:

Bidders must be currently prequalified in accordance with 720 CMR 5.00, Prequalification of Contractors by MassDOT, for this work.

It is the responsibility of each Contractor submitting proposals for the work to assure himself/herself that the equipment/construction methods he/she intends to use are capable of complying with project specifications. The attention of each Contractor submitting a Bid is directed to that portion of the project specifications which require the Contractor to demonstrate to the Engineer the ability of his/her crew(s) and equipment to comply with the specifications requirements and to do so at a rate of production consistent with the time allowed under the contract.

Product Specifications Submittals:

The Bidder must set forth in the space provided herein the information requested and the City's bid documents (specifications) must be accompanied by whatever published material is necessary to fully describe the item being offered in sufficient detail to enable the City to determine that the item offered is in compliance with the specifications contained in the bid invitation.

These specifications are not meant to describe any particular product but rather to establish the basic minimum specifications and requirements of the Division for which the unit is being purchased. The City of Beverly reserves to itself the right to reject any or all bids or to accept any or to allow reasonable variations between the specifications contained in the bid proposal and the specifications set forth in the bid invitation should, in its sole opinion, such action be deemed in to be in the best interests of the City.

Bonds Insurance and Certification:

Bonds: The Contractor shall be required to submit a Bid Bond, payable to the City of Beverly, in an amount equal to 5% of the value of the bid.

Insurance: Please refer to the "Insurance Requirements".

Time Periods:

The Contractor to whom the Contract is awarded shall be required to execute the Contract and furnish the insurance and bonds duly executed with a satisfactory surety company within five (5) days, excluding Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays of the date of the mailing of the

notice to the bidder according to the address given by him/her, that the Contract is ready for execution.

The Contractor shall be required to start work within ten (10) days of receipt of a notice to proceed and shall complete all work in a timely fashion as determined by the Director of Public Services or his designee. Timely fashion shall be determined on a job specific basis by the Director of Public Services or his designee.

NOTE: No sidewalk areas will be left open for more than three (3) working days.

Construction Methods:

SECTION 501 CURB, CURB INLETS, CURB CORNERS AND EDGING DESCRIPTION

501.20 General

This item of work shall consist of furnishing and setting curb, curb inlets, curb corners and edging on a gravel foundation except for bridge curb which is set in full mortar bed and bituminous concrete curb which is placed on a bituminous concrete base, in accordance with these specifications and in close conformity with the lines and grades shown on the plans or established by the Engineer.

MATERIALS

501.40 General

Materials shall conform to the requirements specified in the following Subsection of Division III, Materials:

CONSTRUCTION METHODS

501.60 Excavating Trench

The trench for the curb shall be excavated to a width of 18 inches. The subgrade of the trench shall be a depth below the proposed finished grade of the curb equal to 6 inches plus the depth of the curbstone.

501.61 Preparing Foundation

The foundation for the curb shall consist of gravel spread upon the subgrade and after being thoroughly compacted by tamping shall be 6 inches in depth.

The gravel foundation for edging shall be as shown on the plans and shall be thoroughly rammed or tamped until firm and unyielding.

The foundation for the curb inlet shall consist of a full bed of Portland cement mortar on the supporting back wall of the catch basin or gutter inlet and sufficient gravel on each side to support the overhang. The trench for the gravel foundation shall be at least 6 inches in depth and 18 inches in width. This trench shall be filled with gravel thoroughly tamped to the required grade.

The trench for the curb corner shall be excavated so that there shall be constructed a foundation of gravel which when thoroughly compacted will be 6 inches in depth, and extending 6 inches beyond the front and back of curb corner to the full depth of foundation. Other acceptable material may be used for backing.

501.62 Setting Curb and Edging

Curbing, curb corners or edging shall be set on additional gravel spread upon the foundation.

All spaces under the curb, curb corners or edging shall be filled with gravel thoroughly compacted so that the curb, curb corners or edging will be completely supported throughout their length. The curb shall be set at the line and grade required as shown on the plans unless otherwise directed.

Curb, curb corners or edging shall be fitted together as closely as possible.

If curb, curb corners, curb inlets or edging of different quarries is used on the same project, curbing of each particular quarry shall be segregated and set to give uniform appearance.

All pavements disturbed shall be repaired with the same depth as existing pavements, however if the existing material is less than four and one-half (4 ½) inches, a minimum of four and one-half (4 ½) inches of pavement shall be installed. All curbing shall be set in a bed of concrete in accordance with Massachusetts Department of Public Works Standard Specifications.

501.65 Filling About Trench

After the curb, curb corners, curb inlets, and edging is set, the space between it and the wall of the trench shall be filled with gravel thoroughly tamped to the depth directed, care being taken not to affect the line or grade of the curb, curb corners, curb inlets and edging.

501.67 Pointing

The joints between curbstones (both front and back) or edging shall be carefully filled with cement mortar and neatly pointed on the top and front exposed portions. After pointing, the

curbstones or edging shall be satisfactorily cleaned of all excess mortar that may have been forced out of the joints.

501.68 Transition Curb for Wheelchair Ramps

Transitions from normal curb settings to wheelchair ramps shall be accomplished with transition curb as directed. Transitions shall be of the same type curb and similar to that abutting and, if on a curve, of the same radius.

SECTION 580 CURB OR EDGING REMOVED AND RESET; REMOVED AND STACKED OR REMOVED AND DISCARDED

DESCRIPTION

580.20 General

This work shall consist of removing the present curb, edging, curb comers and curb inlets of every type and cross section made of granite, concrete or granite-faced and resetting or stacking them or discarding them in accordance with these specifications and in close conformity with the lines and grades shown on the plans or established by the Engineer.

MATERIALS

580.40 Curb Edging, Curb Inlets and Curb Corners

Curb, edging, curb inlets and curb comers shall consist of so much of the same as is suitable, in the Engineer's judgment to be reset or stacked.

580.41 Gravel

Gravel shall conform to the requirements of Subsection M1.03.0 Type c of Division III, Materials.

CONSTRUCTION METHODS

580.60 Removal

A trench of sufficient width and depth shall be excavated so that the present curb, edging, curb comers and curb inlets can be removed without damage.

580.61 Protection

The Contractor shall protect all curb or edging and keep it in satisfactory condition until the acceptance of the entire contract. Particular care will be required to prevent any unsatisfactory discoloration of the curb or edging. The Contractor shall replace any existing curb, edging, curb comers and curb inlets that is to be reset, which is lost or damaged as a result of his operations, or because of his failure to store and protect it in a manner that would eliminate its loss or damage.

580.62 Adjustment

The length of any section of curb or edging, shall be altered by cutting in order to fit closures as necessary. The ends of all stones shall be square with the planes of the top and face so that when the stones are placed end-to-end as closely as possible no space shall show in the joint at the top and face of more than 3/4 inch for the full width of the top and for 8 inches down on the face.

580.63 Relaying

The Construction methods for resetting all curbing or edging, in the final location shall conform to the requirements of Subsections 501.60 to 501.62, 501.65 and 501.67.

580.64 Stacking

The Contractor shall accept and hold entire responsibility for the removal, handling, stacking at a location convenient for removal by owner, and protection of all curbing or edging until its final removal as designated in accordance with the following:

Any curbing or edging damaged through lack of protection or carelessness by the Contractor shall be replaced at his expense. The Contractor's responsibility will cease upon final acceptance of the work or 60 days from the time a certified notice, with copy to the Engineer, is sent by Contractor to owner of material that all material is available for removal.

580.65 Discarding

Any curb, edging, curb comers and curb inlets not damaged through lack of protection or carelessness by the Contractor but deemed by the Engineer as unsatisfactory for relaying or stacking, will be discarded. It will be the Contractor's responsibility to dispose of any discarded curb, edging, curb comers and curb inlets without additional compensation.

SECTION 701 SIDEWALKS, WHEELCHAIR RAMPS AND DRIVEWAYS

DESCRIPTION

701.20 General.

This work shall consist of the construction of cement concrete wheelchair ramps, hot mix asphalt or cement concrete sidewalks and driveways in accordance with the specifications and within the tolerances established in the standard drawings or on the plans.

MATERIALS

701.40 General.

Materials shall meet the requirements specified in the following Subsections of Division III, Materials:

CONSTRUCTION

701.60 General

The subgrade for the sidewalks, ramps and driveways shall be shaped parallel to the proposed surface of the walks, ramps and driveways and thoroughly compacted. All depressions occurring shall be filled with suitable material and again compacted until the surface is smooth and hard.

After the subgrade has been prepared, a foundation of gravel shall be placed upon it. After being compacted thoroughly, the foundation shall be at least 8 inches (200 mm) thick and parallel to the proposed surface of the walk.

701.61 Cement Concrete Sidewalks, Sidewalks at Driveways and Wheelchair Ramps

A. Forms

Side forms and transverse forms shall be smooth, free from warp, of sufficient strength to resist springing out of shape, of a depth to conform to the thickness of the proposed walk or ramp and of a type satisfactory to the Engineer.

All mortar or dirt shall be completely removed from forms that have been previously used. The forms shall be well staked and thoroughly graded and set to the established lines with their upper edge conforming to the grade of the finished walk or ramp which shall have sufficient pitch to the roadside edge to provide for surface drainage.

All wheelchair ramp joints and transition sections which define grade changes shall be formed staked and checked for dimension, grade and slope conformance prior to placing cement concrete.

All forms shall be oiled before placing concrete.

B. Placing and Finishing Cement Concrete

The concrete shall be placed in alternate slabs 30 feet (200 mm) long except as otherwise ordered. The slabs shall be separated by transverse performed expansion joint filler ½ inch thick (13 mm).

Prefomed expansion joint filler shall be placed adjacent to or around existing structures as directed.

On the foundation as specified above, the concrete shall be placed in such quantity that after being thoroughly consolidated in place it shall be 4 inches (100 mm) deep. At driveways, the sidewalks shall be 6 inches (200 mm) deep. No finishing operation shall be performed while free water is present. Finishing operations shall be delayed until all bleed water and water sheen has left the surface and the concrete has started to stiffen. After water sheen has disappeared,

edging operations, where required, shall be completed. After edging and joining operations, the surface shall be floated. Immediately following floating, the surface shall be steel-troweled. If necessary tooled joints and edges shall be rerun before and after troweling to maintain uniformity. After troweling, the surface shall be brushed by drawing a soft-bristled pushbroom with a long handle over the surface of the concrete to produce a nonslip surface.

In conveying the concrete from the place of mixing to the place of deposit, the operation shall be conducted in such a manner that no mortar will be lost, and the concrete shall be so handled that the concrete will be of uniform composition throughout, showing neither excess nor lack of mortar in any one place.

The surface of all concrete sidewalks shall be uniformly scored into block units of areas not more than 36 square feet (3.25 m²). The depth of the scoring shall be at least ½ inch (12 mm) deep and no more than ½ inch (12 mm) wide.

The application of neat cement to surfaces in order to hasten hardening is prohibited.

The finishing of concrete surface shall be done by experienced and competent cement finishers.

When completed the walks shall be kept moist and protected from traffic and weather for at least 3 days in accordance with the applicable provisions of Subsection 476.74.

CONCRETE SIDEWALKS

Concrete for sidewalks shall be of domestic Portland Cement conforming to ASTM designation C150, Type II and shall have a minimum allowable compressive strength of 4,000 PSI at twenty-eight (28) days. The use of fly ash shall not be permitted. Fine aggregate shall be washed natural sand conforming to ASTM designation C33. Coarse aggregate shall be well graded crushed stone (at least 75% dark gray or black in color) conforming to ASTM designation C33, with 100 percent passing the three-quarter (¾) inch sieve and zero (0) to five (5) percent passing the No. 8 sieve. All concrete for sidewalks shall be air entrained, induced by the use of an approved air entraining agent added to the "gauge water" at the concrete batching plant. Air entraining cement shall not be used. The amount of air entrainment shall be seven (7) percent.

Water shall be clean, fresh, non-recycled water, suitable for drinking and free from deleterious amounts of acids, alkalis or organic matter.

The maximum water content shall be six (6) gallons / 94 lbs. Sack and the minimum cement content shall be six and one-half (6 ½) (94 lbs.) sacks / cubic yard.

Slump shall be between two (2) and four (4) inches.

A curing compound must be applied to the surface of the concrete within twenty-four (24) hours of initial setting or in accordance with product specifications.

Concrete shall be four (4) inches in thickness for sidewalks and six (6) inches in thickness at driveways. All concrete shall be reinforced with six inch by six inch (6" X 6") No. 10 wire mesh. All sidewalks over thirty (30) linear feet in length shall be furnished with a one-half inch by four inch (½" X 4") bituminous fiber expansion joint as directed.

All sidewalks shall receive a fine broom finish.

701.62 Hot Mix Asphalt Sidewalks and Driveways

A. Forms

Where walls, curbing or other suitable permanent supports are not present or where an approved mechanical spreader is not used, satisfactory forms shall be installed to assist in securing proper alignment and adequate compaction of the base and surface courses.

B. Placing Hot Mix Asphalt Concrete

The hot mix asphalt walk surface shall be laid in 2 courses to a depth after rolling of 2½ inches (60 mm).

The bottom course shall be 1¼ inches (30 mm) thick, and its surface after rolling shall be 1¼ inches (30 mm) below and parallel to the proposed grade of the finished surfaces. The top course shall be 1¼ inches (30 mm) thick after rolling.

The hot mix asphalt driveway surface shall be laid in 2 courses to a depth, after rolling, of 3½ inches (90 mm). The Bottom Course shall be 2 inches (50 mm) thick, and its surface, after rolling, shall be 1½ inches (40 mm) below and parallel to the proposed grade of the finished surface. The top course shall be 1½ inches (40 mm) thick after rolling.

A pedestrian path of travel must be maintained across the driveway opening. The dimensions, cross slope, grades and tolerances of the pedestrian path shall be in conformance with the standard construction drawings.

The surface shall have sufficient pitch to the roadside edge to provide for surface drainage.

The courses shall be constructed in accordance with the applicable requirements of Section 460 and the following provisions:

Spreading Mixture for Sidewalks – The mixture shall be dumped, as needed, in wheelbarrows or on approved steel dump sheets outside the areas on which it is to be placed. It shall then be immediately distributed into place by means of shovels and raked into a uniformly loose layer to the full width required and of such depth that, when work is completed, it shall conform to the grade and surface contour required.

An approved mechanical spreader may be used.

Spreading Mixture for Driveways – The Mixture shall be spread with an approved spreader. In areas not accessible to a spreader, the mix shall be placed as specified for hot mix asphalt sidewalks above.

Rolling Sidewalks – The surface shall be rolled with a self-propelled tandem roller with a mass not less than 1½ tons (1.4 Mg) and not more than 5 tons (4.5 Mg). In places inaccessible to a power roller, compaction shall be obtained by means of mechanical rammers or by hand

tampers with a mass not less than 50 pounds (25 kg) and having a tamping face not exceeding 100 square inches (600 m²).

Rolling Driveways – The surface shall be rolled with a self-propelled tandem roller with a mass not less than 3 tons (2.8 Mg) nor more than 5 tons (4.5 Mg), or an approved roller as designated by the Engineer.

Testing Surface – When tested with a 10 foot (3 m) straightedge placed parallel to the center line of the courses, there shall be no deviation from a true surface in excess of ¼ inch (5 mm).

BITUMINOUS CONCRETE SIDEWALKS

Full Depth Construction:

The Contractor shall excavate, to the limits as directed by the Director of Public Services or his designee, eight and a half (8 ½) inches of existing material, install compact and grade six (6) inches of gravel, and install and grade two (2) courses of bituminous concrete pavement; 2 inches of binder and 1 ½ inches of finish, all measured after compaction and rolling. Contractor shall compact bituminous concrete with a minimum of a one and a half (1 ½) ton roller. All adjacent grass areas shall be reseeded and seeded as required to restore damage or to match the grade of the finished sidewalk.

Sidewalk Overlays:

The Contractor shall trim back all grass from the sidewalk edges and remove all dirt or other foreign material from the surface prior to the application of tack coat or pavement. The bituminous concrete pavement overlays shall be installed at a depth of one and a half (1 ½) inches or as directed. Contractor shall compact bituminous concrete with a minimum of a one and a half (1 ½) ton roller.

Grade and Appearance:

All finished sidewalks shall be level with trimmed edges and shall be uniform in appearance. Establishment of grades shall be the responsibility of the Contractor. New sidewalks shall be installed to insure the front edge is six (6) inches above the roadway gutter. All sidewalks shall be installed slopping towards the roadway with a cross slope of ¼ inches per foot. The Director of Public Services or his designee may waive or alter certain grading requirements due to existing conditions.

Prime or Tack Coat:

The edges of all pavement ends or where existing areas are to be overlaid shall receive an application of prime or tack coat prior to the placement of pavement.

Materials:

Bituminous concrete pavement and tack coat shall conform to the requirements of Section 460 of the "Commonwealth of Massachusetts Department of Public Works, Standard Specifications for

Highways and Bridges" for Class I Bituminous Concrete Pavement Type I-1. The composition of types of pavement to be utilized shall conform to Subsection M3.11.00 and shall be as follows:

Sidewalk Overlay and Top Course:	½" State Top
Sidewalk Base Course:	¾" Binder

Gravel:

Shall conform to the requirements of Section 151 of the Standard Specifications with no stone having a dimension greater than one (1) inch in the largest dimension. Dense graded crushed stone (Lyn Pac) may be substituted for gravel base.

SECTION 751 LOAM BORROW AND TOPSOIL REHANDLED AND SPREAD
DESCRIPTION

751.20 General

The work under this item consists of furnishing and placing loam and related items on an approved area in accordance with these specifications and in close conformity with the lines and grades shown on the plans or established by the Engineer. The work includes the placing, spreading and grading of loam borrow for seeded and planted areas, preparation of soil for plant material, amendment of loam as required to produce planting soil mix, and provision of soil additives required to adjust for pH requirements of specific plants.

MATERIALS

751.40 General

Material shall meet the requirements specified in the following Subsections of Division III, Materials:

Loam Borrow	M1.05.0
Topsoil	M1.07.0
Organic Soil Additives	M1.06.0
Inorganic Amendments	M6.01.0

Samples and Submittals

At least 30 days prior to ordering, the Contractor shall submit to the Engineer representative samples, certifications, and certified test results for materials as specified below. No materials shall be delivered until the required submittals have been reviewed and approved by the Engineer. Delivered materials shall closely match the approved samples. Approval of test results does not constitute final acceptance.

The Engineer reserves the right to reject on or after delivery any material which does not meet the Specifications.

Soil Additives for Loam

Additives shall be used to counteract soil deficiencies as recommended by the soil analysis.

Organic matter used as an amendment to soil shall be manufactured compost.

Lime or sulfur shall be used to bring soil to acceptable pH levels, per soil test reports.

For soils with more than 20 percent passing the No. 200 sieve (75 μm), gypsum shall be added at a rate of 3.2 pounds per cubic foot (5kg/m³).

Soil amendments shall be incorporated thoroughly into loam to meet the specified requirements for loam prior to delivering the material on site.

CONSTRUCTION METHODS

751.60 Preparation of Areas on which Loam or Topsoil are to be Placed

All areas to receive loam shall be free of construction debris, refuse, compressible or decayable materials and standing water. The area upon which the above materials are to be placed shall be raked, harrowed or dragged to form a smooth surface. All stones, undesirable growth and debris larger than 2 inches (50 mm) in diameter shall be removed from the area and disposed of by the Contractor outside the location.

When directed by the Engineer, additional suitable material available from excavation or furnished under Item 150, Ordinary Borrow, shall be spread as required to repair gullies or depressions. The labor, equipment and materials necessary to place, compact and grade the additional material shall be paid for under the respective item from which the material is obtained.

751.61 Placing Loam or Topsoil

The Contractor shall notify the Engineer when areas to receive loam are ready for inspection and approval. Placement of loam fill material shall not begin until the Engineer has approved the subgrade.

Loam shall not be handled or placed when the subgrade or the loam is frozen or saturated, i.e. when squeezed sample shows any sign of free moisture.

The Engineer shall approve the use of the Contractor's equipment. Any equipment or procedures that are likely to damage or over-compact underlying structure or materials shall be rejected.

Loam shall be placed in lifts not to exceed 4 inches (100 mm). After each lift, the soil shall be thoroughly mixed into the soil layer beneath it. Compaction of each lift shall be minimal, sufficient only to achieve the required grades. Over-compaction of existing soils or fills that would be detrimental to planting objectives shall be corrected by tilling or other means at no additional cost.

Grade stakes shall be set to check finished grades. Deviation from lines and grades that are greater than 1 inch (25 mm) shall not be permitted.

The Contractor shall supply additional loam as necessary so that following finish the grading and compaction operations, the placed loam shall conform to the depth required. Finish grades shall exhibit no abrupt changes, and shall blend in evenly with the undisturbed grade of the ground at the limits of work.

During hauling operations, the roadway surfaces shall be kept clean and any loam or other dirt which may be brought upon the surface shall be removed promptly and thoroughly before it becomes compacted by traffic. If necessary, the wheels of all vehicles used for hauling shall be cleaned frequently and kept clean to avoid bringing any dirt upon the surface. The Contractor shall take all reasonable precautions to avoid injury to existing or planted growth.

751.62 Topsoil Rehandled and Spread

Topsoil which is obtained on the site from piles of topsoil previously excavated and stacked in accordance with the relevant provisions of Section 120 and designated as topsoil to be rehandled and spread shall be used as required, and as directed by the Engineer, on areas to be seeded or planted.

The topsoil must meet the requirements of M1.07.0 and be approved before it is spread. The Contractor will be required, without additional compensation, to take corrective action as directed, in order to make the topsoil suitable for its intended use.

The Contractor is required under the item of seeding to adjust the acidity by the addition of limestone as determined by testing as required under Subsection 765.61 and to apply the fertilizer as required under Subsection 765.62.

SECTION 765 SEEDING

DESCRIPTION

765.40 General

This work shall consist of seeding certain areas at the locations indicated on the plans or designated by the Engineer, in accordance with these specifications.

MATERIALS

Materials shall meet the requirements specified in the following Subsection of Division III, Materials:

Limestone	M6.01.0
Fertilizer	M6.02.0
Grass Seed	M6.03.0
Crownvetch Seed	M6.03.2

CONSTRUCTION METHODS

765.60 General

The Contractor shall not proceed with the work of seeding until permission of the Engineer has been obtained.

Before the application of limestone, fertilizer and seed, the Contractor shall harrow or roto-till to a depth on inches, when directed, all areas where loam or topsoil, has been placed under a previous contract when such areas are to be prepared for seeding under this contract. When loam borrow is placed, or topsoil is rehandled and spread; and they are paid for under the respective items of a contract, they will not require harrowing or roto-tilling.

The Contractor shall remove all debris and stones having any dimensions greater than 2 inches before the application of limestone, fertilizer and seed.

765.61 Application of Limestone

Limestone may be applied in dry form or hydraulically as provided in Subsection 765.65. Limestone where necessary shall be spread and thoroughly incorporated in the layer of loam or topsoil to adjust the acidity of the loam or topsoil. The rate of application of the limestone will vary up to a maximum of 1 pound per square yard depending on the results of laboratory tests conducted by the Department. The limestone shall be thoroughly incorporated into the layer of loam or topsoil and the upper 1 inch of the underlying subsoil by harrowing or other methods satisfactory to the Engineer so as to provide a layer of thoroughly mixed material for the seed bed.

765.62 Application of Fertilizer for Grass

Fertilizer may be applied in dry form or hydraulically as provided in Subsection 765.65. After the application of limestone, if found necessary, on the seed bed, fertilizer shall be spread on the top layer of loam or topsoil at the rate of 800 pounds per acre and worked into the seed bed. The full depth of loam or topsoil shall then be spaded or harrowed and graded to the required cross section.

765.63 Seeding Grass

After the loamed or topsoil areas have been prepared and treated as hereinbefore described, grass seed conforming to the respective formulas hereinbefore specified shall be carefully sown thereon at the rate of approximately 50 pounds per acre. Seeding shall be done in two directions at right angles to each other. Seeding on level areas and on slopes up to and including 4:1 slopes shall be done by means of an approved seeder that will seed and roll in one operation. On shoulders and other narrow areas, the seeding may be done longitudinally in one application.

765.64 Seeding Crownvetch

When crownvetch (Emerald, Chemung or Pennigift variety) is to be planted by direct seeding, the slopes shall be prepared by spreading Limestone at the rate of two (2) tons per acre or 100 pounds per 1000 square feet.

Fertilizer, granular 5-20-20, shall be applied to the slopes at the rate of 800 pounds per acre, or 800 pounds per acre of granular 0-20-20 plus 40 pounds per acre of N derived from organic material.

The Limestone and Fertilizer shall then be mixed into the soil on the slope by raking or other suitable method.

Crownvetch will not grow satisfactorily in soil with a ph factor of less than 6.0 to 6.5.

Crownvetch seed, minimum 70% germination, including hard seed, shall be treated with an inoculants before sowing. A four (4) ounce package of inoculant is supplied with each 20 pounds of Crownvetch seed.

The seed shall be moistened by pouring on a cup of saturate sugar solution and thoroughly mixed. Then the inoculant, a powder is blended with moistened seed by mixing.

The mixture shall then be sown by hand or a drill spreader (The hydraulic method will not be permitted) at a rate of 20 pounds of seed per acre of 7 ¼ ounces per 1000 square feet.

Perennial Rye grass seed shall then be spread at the rate of 15 pounds per acre or 5 ½ ounces per 1000 square feet. This rate of seeding must not be exceeded at any time.

The seeds shall then be raked into the previously prepared slope.

Under no condition shall any other grass seed mixture, either plot or slope be sown in the areas of planting because of the competition between the desired crownvetch and the grass.

The slope shall then be covered with two (2) tons of Hay (long strands - minimum 10 inch length) per acre.

765.65 Seeding Grass by Spray Machine

A hydraulic spray machine, approved by the Engineer, and designed specifically for seed dissemination may be utilized. The application of limestone as necessary, fertilizer and grass seed may be accomplished in one operation by the use of an approved spraying machine. The materials shall be mixed with water in the machine and kept in an agitated state in order that the materials may be uniformly suspended in the water. The spraying equipment shall be so designed that when the solution is sprayed over an area the resulting deposits of limestone, fertilizer and grass seed shall be equal in quantity to those quantities specified above in Subsections 765.61, 765.62 and 765.63.

A certified statement shall be furnished, prior to start of work, to the Engineer by the Contractor as to the number of pounds of limestone, fertilizer, and grass seed, per 100 gals. of water.

This statement should also specify the number of square yards of seeding that can be covered with the solution specified above.

If the results of the spray operation are unsatisfactory, the Contractor will be required to abandon this method and to apply the limestone, fertilizer and seed in accordance with the requirements of Subsections 765.61, 765.62 and 765.63.

765.66 Care During Construction

The Contractor shall be responsible for the watering of all seeded and grassed areas which shall be kept moist. The Engineer's decision will prevail in the event a dispute develops with the Contractor as to whether or not the seeded and grassed areas are moist. Seeded areas on which growth has started shall be watered to a minimum depth of 2 inches to assure continuing growth. Watering shall be done in a manner which will provide uniform coverage, prevent erosion due to application of excessive quantities over small areas, and prevent damage to the finished surface by the watering equipment. The Contractor shall furnish sufficient watering equipment to apply one complete coverage to the seeded areas in an 8 hour period.

If necessary, suitable signs and barricades of brush or other materials shall be placed to protect the seeded areas.

After the grass has appeared, all areas and parts of areas which fail to show a uniform stand of grass, for any reason whatsoever, shall be reseeded and such areas and parts of areas shall be seeded repeatedly until all areas are covered with a satisfactory growth of grass.

The Contractor shall care for all of the seeded areas until the work has been physically accepted, without compensation in addition to the amount regularly to be paid under this item as hereinafter provided. Care shall include all regrading, refertilizing, reseeding and mowing which may be necessary.

Prior to the acceptance of the project the Contractor will be responsible for mowing the grass when necessary on all flat or rolling slopes from level to and including 4 to 1 slopes to a height of 3 inches when the grass has attained a height of eight inches. The grass on all slopes steeper than 4 to 1 shall be cut when necessary to a height of 3 inches at such a time as a stable turf has been established in the Engineer's judgment.

765.67 Liability

A satisfactory stand of grass, as determined by the Engineer, shall be required. To be acceptable, a stand of grass shall consist of a uniform stand of at least 60 percent established permanent grass species, with a uniform count of at least 100 plants per square foot.

When all items of the contract, including the work specified under this item, have been acceptably completed except that a satisfactory stand of grass has not been produced, the contract may be accepted.

The rate of establishment of the crownvetch seeding shall consist of a uniform stand of at least 3 vigorous plants per twenty five (25) square feet. Before final acceptance, all areas twenty five

(25) square feet or larger, devoid of suitable crownvetch seedings shall be planted with crownvetch plants as specified in Subsection 771.67 of this specification at the rate of one (1) plant per twenty five (25) square feet.

HANDICAPPED RAMPS

All curb cuts and sidewalks must comply with **Mass Highway Department's "Wheelchair Ramp Standards"** latest edition and **521 CMR 21** latest edition. Any curb cuts constructed that do not comply with these regulations must be reconstructed at contractors' expense.

521 CMR: ARCHITECTURAL ACCESS BOARD

21.00: CURB CUTS


21.1 GENERAL

Whenever *sidewalks, walkways, or curbs* on streets and ways are *constructed, reconstructed, or repaired*, *curb cuts* are required. All *curb cuts* shall comply with the following:

21.2 LOCATION

Curb cuts shall occur wherever an *accessible route* crosses a curb and at the following locations:

21.2.1 *Curb cuts* are required at each corner of each intersection, located within the crosswalk and/or the pedestrian path of travel. *Curb cuts* shall be perpendicular to the curb at street crossings and each shall have a *level* landing at the top. At marked crossings, the bottom of the *ramp* run, exclusive of flared sides, shall be wholly contained with the marked crossing. See **Fig. 21a**. The crosswalk/pedestrian path of travel must also be perpendicular to the curb.

Exception: Where pedestrian right-of-way established width will not accommodate a perpendicular *curb cut* and landing, a parallel public *sidewalk curb cut* with a *level landing* at its bottom shall be provided instead of a perpendicular *curb cut*.

21.2.1.1 *Apex curb cuts*: Where site constraints prevent the installation of a perpendicular *curb cut* or a parallel *curb cut* with a level landing, an apex curb cut is allowed. Site constraints include the following:


- a. Driver or pedestrian line of sight to or from the front of the level landing on the ramp is impaired, preventing safe observation of crosswalks or approaching traffic at the intersection by a significant immovable or unalterable streetscape feature such as a building, structure or historic element, etc.
- b. Stop line is beyond the allowed limit as stated in the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.
- c. Vaults containing electrical, telecommunications, etc. that are under or on the existing sidewalk.
- d. Large radius intersections which are 30 feet or greater.

21.2.1.2 When apex *curb cuts* are installed a 48 inch (48" = 1219mm) landing shall also be provided at the bottom of the *curb cut* and located within the marked crosswalk.

- 21.2.2 Reciprocal *curb cuts*: When *curb cuts* or *sidewalks* are being *constructed* or *reconstructed* on one side of the street, and when such *curb cuts* or *sidewalks* are connected to an opposite side of the street by one or more pedestrian paths of travel, then at least one *curb cut* shall be provided on the opposite side of the street where such side is controlled by the same owner.
- 21.2.3 Driveways: *Curb cuts* are required at driveways intersecting *sidewalks* when the driveway has side curbs.
- 21.2.4 Raised Islands: Any raised islands in crossings shall be cut through *level* with the street or have *curb cuts* at both sides and a *level* area at least 48 inches (48" = 1219mm) long between the *curb cuts* in the part of the island intersected by the crossings.
- 21.2.5 Obstructions: *Curb cuts* shall be located or protected to prevent their obstruction by parked vehicles.

21.3 SLOPE

The least possible slope should be used for any ramp. The maximum slope shall be one-in-12 (1:12) (8.3%). Where *sidewalks* are too narrow to install a straight-line *curb cut* at a slope of one-in-12 (1:12) (8.3%), the sides of the *curb cut* shall not exceed one-in-12 (1:12) (8.3%). See Fig. 21b. The maximum cross-slope for any *curb cut* shall be 1:50 (2%). (There is no tolerance allowed on slope requirements). (Refer to 521 CMR 2.4.4d).

21.4 TRANSITIONS

Transitions from *curb cuts* to *walks*, *gutters*, or *streets* shall be flush or free of changes in *level* greater than ½ inch (½" = 13mm). Maximum slopes of adjoining *gutters*, *road surface* immediately adjacent to the *curb cuts*, or *accessible route* shall not exceed one-in-20 (1:20) (5%).

21.5 DRAINAGE

Grading and drainage shall be designed to minimize pooling of water, accumulation of ice, or flow of water across the base of the *curb cut*.

21.6 WIDTH

The minimum width of a *curb cut* shall be 36 inches (36" = 914mm), exclusive of flared sides. See Fig. 21c.


- 21.6.1 Landing width: Where a perpendicular *curb cut* is provided, a landing the width of the *curb cut* shall be provided at the top of the *curb cut*. The landing shall be 48 inches (48" = 1219mm) in length. The slope of said landing shall not exceed one-in-50 (1:50) (2%) in any direction.

21.7 FLARED SIDES

Sides of *curb cuts* shall extend at least 24 inches (24" = 610mm) at the curb. The maximum slope of the flare is one-in-ten (1:10) (10%). Curbing at the flared sides must blend with the slope of the flared sides. See Fig. 21c.

21.8 RETURNED SIDES


Curb cuts with returned sides are only permitted where they are protected by handrails pursuant to 521 CMR 24.5, **Handrails** or where pedestrian travel across the *ramp* is obstructed by permanently installed street hardware or landscaping. See Fig. 21d

21.9 BUILT-UP CURB CUTS

Built-up *curb cuts* are allowed only where they do not project into vehicular traffic lanes. See Fig. 21e.



21.10 PEDESTRIAN STREET CROSSINGS

Where provided, pedestrian street crossings at, above, or below grade shall comply with the following:

- 21.10.1 Crossing controls shall be raised from or flush with their housings and shall be a minimum of two inches (2" = 51mm) in the smallest dimension. The force required to activate controls shall be no greater than 5 lbs.
- 21.10.2 Location: Controls shall be located as close as practicable to the *curb cut* serving the controlled crossing and shall permit operation from a *clear ground space*. 521 CMR: ARCHITECTURAL ACCESS BOARD 1/27/06 521 CMR - 100
- 21.10.3 Mounting Height: Pedestrian-actuated crossing controls shall be a maximum of 42 inches (42" = 1067mm) above the finished *sidewalk*.
- 21.10.4 *Clear ground space*: A stable and firm area, complying with 521 CMR 6.5, **Forward Reach**, or 521 CMR 6.6, **Side Reach** shall be provided at the controls. Where a parallel approach is provided, controls shall be within ten inches (10" = 254mm) horizontally of and centered on the *clear ground space*. Where a forward approach is provided, controls shall abut and be centered on the *clear ground space*.

BRICKS FOR SIDEWALKS:

Bricks for sidewalks shall be of red "City Hall Pavers" and shall be placed in a full bed of mortar base which is continuous with the sidewalk cement.

The unit price for brick sidewalks shall include full compensation for all costs associated with the furnishing and installation of all materials including the necessary formwork for sidewalks and treewells as directed.

All vertical surfaces where bricks (with mortar bed) and concrete meet shall be separated with a one-half inch (1/2") bituminous fiber expansion joint as directed.

GENERAL:

Signs:

Any signs that require removal for the proper construction of the ramp must be reinstalled by the contractor. If it is determined that the sign base does not conform to current City standards as determined by Director of Public Services or his designee, then a new sign base shall be provided by the City of Beverly.

Open Excavations:

The Contractors attention is directed that the sidewalks and curbing to be installed or reset are on public ways and that **all work and open excavations** shall be properly and safely barricaded and lighted **at all times** until the work is complete. The unit prices of all items shall include compensation for such barricades and lighting.

Disposal of Excess Materials:

All excess excavated material shall become the property of the Contractor and shall be properly disposed of at approved sites. All cost involved with the handling and disposal of surplus or unsuitable material shall be compensated for under the Bid Items. No separate costs for disposal of materials shall be allowed.

Clean Up:

The Contractor shall keep the site of his/her operations as clean and neat as possible. He/She shall dispose of all residue resulting from the construction work and at the conclusion of the day's work, he/she shall remove and haul away any surplus excavation, broken pavement, lumber, equipment and any other refuse remaining from the construction operations and shall leave the site in a clean and neat orderly condition upon the completion of work.

MONTHLY PRICE ADJUSTMENT FOR HOT MIX ASPHALT (HMA) MIXTURES
ENGLISH UNITS

February 2, 2009

The Price Adjustment will be based on the variance in price for the liquid asphalt component only from the Base Price to the Period Price. It shall not include transportation or other charges. This Price Adjustment will occur on a monthly basis.

This provision applies to all projects using greater than 100 tons of hot mix asphalt (HMA) mixtures containing liquid asphalt cement as stipulated in the Notice to Contractors section of the bid documents.

Base Price

The Base Price of liquid asphalt on a project as listed in the Notice to Contractors section of the bid documents is a fixed price determined at the time of bid by the Department by using the same method as for the determination of the Period Price detailed below.

Period Price

Please note that, starting December 15, 2008, two sets of period prices will be posted each month on the MassHighway website at <http://www.mhd.state.ma.us/>. They will be labeled "New Asphalt Period Price Method" and "Old Asphalt Period Price Method".

New Asphalt Period Price Method

The "New Asphalt Period Price Method" is for contracts bid after December 15, 2008 and will show the Period Price of liquid asphalt for each monthly period as determined by MassHighway using the average selling price per standard ton of PG64-28 paving grade (primary binder classification) asphalt, FOB manufacturer's terminal, as listed under the "East Coast Market - New England, Boston, Massachusetts area" section of the Poten & Partners, Inc. "Asphalt Weekly Monitor". This average selling price is listed in the issue having a publication date of the second Friday of the month and will be posted as the Period Price for that month. MassHighway will post this Period Price on this website within two (2) business days following their receipt of the relevant issue of the "Asphalt Weekly Monitor". Poten and Partners has granted MassHighway the right to publish this specific asphalt price information sourced from the Asphalt Weekly Monitor.

Old Asphalt Period Price Method

The "Old Asphalt Period Price Method" Period Price will be for contracts bid on or before December 15, 2008 and will contain liquid asphalt prices as determined by the old or previous method. These prices will continue to be posted on MassHighway's website until all contracts using the "Old Asphalt Period Price Method" Period Price have been closed.

New and Old Asphalt Period Price Methods

The paragraphs below apply to both the New and the Old Asphalt Period Price Methods.

The Contract Price of the hot mix asphalt mixture will be paid under the respective item in the Contract. The price adjustment, as herein provided, upwards or downwards, will be made after the work has been performed, using the monthly period price for the month during which the work was performed.

The Price Adjustment applies only to the actual virgin liquid asphalt content in the mixture placed on the job in accordance with the Standard Specifications for Highways and Bridges, Division III, Section M3.11.03.

The Price Adjustment will be a separate payment item. It will be determined by multiplying the number of tons of hot mix asphalt mixtures placed during each monthly period times the liquid

asphalt content percentage times the variance in price between Base Price and Period Price of liquid asphalt.

This Price Adjustment will be paid only if the variance from the Base Price is 5% or more for a monthly period. The complete adjustment will be paid in all cases with no deduction of the 5% from either upward or downward adjustments.

No Price Adjustment will be allowed beyond the Completion Date of this Contract, unless there is a Department-approved extension of time.

PRICE ADJUSTMENT FOR PORTLAND CEMENT CONCRETE MIXES

This provision applies to all projects using greater than 100 Cubic Yards (76 Cubic Meters) of Portland cement concrete containing Portland cement as stipulated in the Notice to Contractors section of the Bid Documents. This Price Adjustment will occur on a monthly basis.

The Price Adjustment will be based on the variance in price for the Portland cement component only from the Base Price to the Period Price. It shall not include transportation or other charges.

The Base Price of Portland cement on a project is a fixed price determined at the time of bid by the Department by using the same method as for the determination of the Period Price (see below) and found in the Notice to Contractors.

The Period Price of Portland cement will be determined by using the latest published price, in dollars per ton (U.S.), for Portland cement (Type I) quoted for Boston, U.S.A. in the **Construction Economics** section of *ENR Engineering News-Record* magazine or at the ENR website <http://www.enr.com> under **Construction Economics**. The Period Price will be posted on the MassHighway website the Wednesday immediately following the publishing of the monthly price in ENR, which is normally the first week of the month.

The Contract Price of the Portland cement concrete mix will be paid under the respective item in the Contract. The price adjustment, as herein provided, upwards or downwards, will be made after the work has been performed, using the monthly period price for the month during which the work was performed.

~~The price adjustment applies only to the actual Portland cement content in the mix placed on the job in accordance with the Standard Specifications for Highways and Bridges, Division III, Section M4.02.01. No adjustments will be made for any cement replacement materials such as fly ash or ground granulated blast furnace slag.~~

The Price Adjustment will be a separate payment item. It will be determined by multiplying the number of cubic yards of Portland cement concrete placed during each monthly period times the Portland cement content percentage times the variance in price between the Base Price and Period Price of Portland cement.

This Price Adjustment will be paid only if the variance from the Base Price is 5% or more for a monthly period. The complete adjustment will be paid in all cases with no deduction of the 5% from either upward or downward adjustments.

No Price Adjustment will be allowed beyond the Completion Date of this Contract, unless there is a Department-approved extension of time.

Work to be Completed by Others:

The City will do all clearing and grubbing, drainage, mailboxes, guardrails, and furnish traffic police as required.

Method of Measurement:

Granite curb will be paid for at the contract unit price per linear foot under the item for the particular type of curb, complete in place. Curb inlets will be paid for at the contract unit price each under the respective item for the particular type of inlet, either straight or curved, complete in place. All curb comers will be paid for at the contract Unit price for each, under the item for the particular type of corner required, complete in place.

Granite curbs' unit price shall constitute full compensation for the resetting or setting granite curbs, to the lines and grades as established by the Engineer, including all labor and equipment necessary to remove and reset curbings, obtain curbings from the City's stockpile, excavation, backfill, compaction and the replacement of any disturbed driveways, grass areas, roadways or walkways.

Hot Mix Asphalt Walk Surface, and Hot Mix Asphalt Driveway will be paid for at the contract unit price per square yard complete in place.

Cement Concrete Sidewalk and Cement Concrete Wheelchair Ramp will be paid for at the contract unit price per square yard complete in place.

A complete handicap ramp includes all granite curbing (flat stone across the entrance and the tip downs at the wings), Portland cement concrete (ramp, wings and landing) and truncated dome (yellow in color unless directed by Director of Public Services or his designee).

Brick sidewalks removed and relayed will be paid for at the contract unit price per square yard complete in place.

Loam Borrow will be paid for at the contract unit price per cubic yard, complete in place, and accepted.

The quantity of seeding shall be the number of square yards based on actual measurements made over the general contour of the areas seeded, complete in place, and accepted.

Miscellaneous compensation for the resetting of all parking meters, sign posts or other similar posts, watergates, manholes or other objects shall be included in the price bid for furnishing concrete and/or hot mix asphalt sidewalks/handicap ramps.

The bid price shall include compensation for furnishing a watchman to protect the concrete from vandalism caused by people, animals, vehicles or other elements until it has sufficiently cured. In the result any concrete has been damaged it shall be replaced at no additional cost to the City.

This Contract is subject to and conditioned upon appropriation by the City.

ARTICLE III. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

- A. The General Contractor shall purchase and maintain such insurance as will protect him from claims under worker's compensation acts and from claims for damages because of bodily injury, including death, and property damage which might arise from and during operations under this contract, whether such operations be by himself or by a Subcontractor or anyone directly or indirectly employed by either of them.
- B. Contractor shall not commence work under this Contract until he has obtained all insurance required herein nor until such insurance has been approved by the Owner. Contractor shall not allow any Subcontractor to commence work until the insurance required of the Subcontractor has been obtained and approved.
- C. Subcontracts: Contractor shall either (1) require each Subcontractor to procure and to maintain during the life of his Subcontract, Subcontractor has General Liability and Property Damage Insurance of same type and in such manner as specified herein, or (2) Insure activities of his Subcontractors on his own policy.
- D. All insurance required by this Document shall be provided by a Best "A+ VIII" rated company, or companies, authorized to do business in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and satisfactory to the owner and shall be written for not less than any limits of liability specified herein, or required by law, whichever is greater.

- E. Certificates: Certificates of Insurance acceptable to the Owner shall be submitted in triplicate to the Owner simultaneously with the execution of the Contract. Certificates shall indicate that broad form Contractual Liability coverage is in force, as well as deletions of the XCU exclusions. Certificates shall contain a provision that the insurance company will notify the Owner by registered mail at least (60) calendar days in advance of any cancellation, non-renewal, change or expiration of the policies. 
