### Moraine Farm to JC Phillips and The Olmsted Landscape

Join Darren Brown, from the Beverly Historical Society to learn about the history of these properties around Wenham Lake. Moraine Farm remains an outstanding example of Frederick Law Olmsted's residential designs. Originally laid out in 1880, the property still features the roads and meadows laid out by Olmsted. Today, The Trustees of Reservations, the Cape Ann Waldorf School and Project Adventure, along with the Batchelder Trust and the Essex County Greenbelt Association, work together to ensure that Olmsted's design is maintained. OSRC member Dave Brewster will be looking for any early migrant birds which might be present along the trails.

**Parking will be available in the Cape Ann Waldorf School's overflow parking lot, which is on your right coming in the driveway. There are 2 options when you turn right at the CAWS sign. Park in the left lot.**

### Birds, Blooms and Photos at Long Hill
