7:15PM-#153-Loan Authorization to facilitate the ordering of a new ladder truck

Kent reads the order. Mayor Cahill expresses his thanks to Chief Cotter and Deputy O'Conner for explaining the need for a new truck. Ayles adds that the intent is to authorize loan order which will allow the ordering of the truck, but no payment will be made until the truck is received, at which point, the city should have enough free cash to pay for it. This will require a free cash transfer in the fall, rescinding the loan at that time. Perry comments that as budget analyst he does not see any issues with this plan and recommends it, but comments that it will involve a return in November.

Houseman asks for clarification about the process of borrowing funds but not incurring actual borrowing costs. Ayles clarifies that it is assumed that the return will be the same as last year, assuming sufficient funds in the fall. Ames asks about potential cuts by the end of the year. Ayles says that the final number is yet to be determined, will be finalized over the next month, and asks Chief Cotter to speak to the fit of the truck to the city today. Chief Cotter states that the truck will be a big asset because previously a ladder truck was not often available for search and rescue, but the department will now be able to be assign it to those specific incidents.

Resolution Beverly Police Department

Whereas: The Beverly Police Department’s Mission Statement reads in part, “While maintaining respect for individual rights, human dignity, cultural diversity and community values, we pledge to sustain a working partnership with our community to protect life and property and to maintain a safe and peaceful environment for all.” This core belief and the partnerships forged with citizens and various community organizations has made Beverly one of the safest cities in the Commonwealth to live in.

Whereas: The Beverly Police Department Community Advisory Committee which includes citizen volunteers offers the public a way to make suggestions on how to make Beverly a better, safer and cleaner place to live. Projects worked on by the CAC include removing graffiti from our streets, downtown and neighborhoods, providing education to reduce drug abuse and the implementation of a 25 MPH citywide speed limit to reduce the volume of speeding and dangerous drivers on our roads. Each year the CAC also recognizes Beverly students who participate in their yearly art contest.

Whereas: The Beverly Police Department’s Community Impact Unit is making a difference in our city by responding to issues that have been raised by members of the community. This year the department was awarded a \$90,000 grant from the Massachusetts Department of Mental Health to hire a Jail Diversion Worker whose job will include helping those residents with mental health disorders as well as assisting with overdose follow-up treatment.

Whereas: The presence of the Beverly Police Department can be found at the forefront of making Beverly a better place for all of the city’s residents. Chief John LeLacheur is an active member of the City of Beverly’s Human Rights Committee and has said on more than one occasion “We will not tolerate intolerance in Beverly.” Officers from the Beverly Police Department have been present during several recent peaceful protests and have maintained a professional demeanor by remaining neutral thus ensuring that all citizens present remained safe and were able to execute their constitutional rights.

Whereas: The Beverly Police Department is committed to keeping our schools a safe place for students to learn, grow and thrive. The School Resource Officer program is a collaborative effort by law enforcement, officers, court personnel, educators, students, parents and the community to reduce crime while providing a safe and secure learning environment for everyone. The officer’s duties include conducting school safety and prevention programs and counsel students and their parents in some of the many complex issues they may be facing. The department’s Student Resource Officers also serve as ad-hoc members of the YMCA’s Beverly Youth Collaboration Board and maintain a presence in the city’s eight private schools as well.

Whereas: The Beverly Police Department is committed to the rapid dissemination of public safety information to the citizens of Beverly. The department has enhanced its communication technology and social media applications. The city's Swift Reach phone system, BPD Facebook, Twitter, My PD smartphone application and the Beverly Police Website www.beverlypd.org have made it easier and more effective to provide timely and concise community safety information to the public.

Whereas: Even during the current Covid 19 pandemic, members of the Beverly Police Department have been ready to answer the call. From something as simple as helping an elderly person cross the street to saving someone's life by administering a dose of NARCAN, the men and women of the department take pride in every task and responsibility asked of them as individuals and as a department. Lifesaving medical aid, suicide prevention, keeping businesses safe and secure, eliminating drugs from our streets and investigating any number of crimes are all in a day's work for members of the Beverly Police Department. The members of The Beverly Police Department come to the aid of all citizens regardless of their color, race, gender, political views, health or economic status.

Whereas: For over two decades the men and women of the Beverly Police Department have been working in substandard and crowded facility. While the City of Beverly took care of other building needs (six elementary schools, a high school and a middle school to name a few), the force has waited patiently and professionally to have their space needs met. The City of Beverly as well as the department is looking forward to the completion of Beverly's new police station in the summer of 2021.

In May 1998, Lisa and Michael Curtis received a \$5,500 zero (0.0%) interest, deferred fifteen loan through the City’s first-time homebuyer program to assist their purchase of a home at 20 Cressy Street. The City presently holds a second mortgage interest on the property.

At this time, Mr. & Mrs. Curtis are seeking to refinance their first mortgage loan to obtain a lower interest rate. They will not withdraw any equity from the property. They have requested the City subordinate its current interest to the new first mortgage, securing a \$131,000.00 loan. The City previously agreed to subordinate its mortgage when the Curtises refinanced in April 2009.

The combined first mortgage and City mortgage loans would total \$ 136,500.00. The appraised value of the property is \$462,000.00. The combined loan-to-appraised value ratio is 30%. The assessed value of the property is \$406,500.00. The combined loan-to-assessed value ratio is 34%. Both ratios indicate an adequate level of comfort to consider the Curtises’ request.

Given the nature of the refinancing and the strong loan-to-value ratios, I have enclosed the proposed Subordination Agreement for your signature, following City Council approval. In order to make their closing, the Curtises would appreciate if this can be heard at the September 8, 2020 City Council meeting.

Dear President Guanci and Members of the City Council,

The Community Preservation Committee (CPC) herein submits the recommended Fiscal Year 2021 CPA Budget, as attached.

In coordination with Finance Director Bryant Ayles, the CPC reviewed the attached budget at its August 20, 2020 meeting and voted unanimously (8-0) to recommend its adoption.

The CPC respectfully requests that the City Council consider approving the budget as proposed.

At the same Community Preservation Committee meeting referenced above the CPC voted unanimously (8-0) to recommend funding in the amount of \$700,000.00 (seven hundred thousand dollars), as requested jointly, by project developers Harborlight Community Partners (HCP) and Beacon Communities, for the project known as Briscoe Village for Living and the Arts. HCP and Beacon Communities had requested these funds to support the construction of new affordable housing rental units and the preservation of an historic resource. The members of the CPC enthusiastically supported this project given both HCP's and Beacon Communities strong reputation as developers and managers of affordable housing. The Committee was also impressed with the scope of this project, which includes 85 units of affordable senior housing in addition to six market rate, live/work studios, with a preference for artists, the preservation of historically significant architectural elements and the preservation and creation of passive and active recreational space. The CPC voted that the proposed project met general CPA funding criteria, criteria as an out-of-cycle project as well as category-specific criteria for a project encompassing both community housing and historic resources.

Given that remaining CPA funds budgeted for FY20 are not sufficient to support a \$700,000.00 appropriation the CPC voted to recommend that the City Council appropriate the remaining balance in its

FY20 Community Housing Reserve fund and the remaining balance in its FY20 General Reserve fund for this project. Upon approval of the CPA FY21 budget by the Beverly City Council the CPC voted to recommend the appropriation of the CPA FY21 Community Housing Reserve balance, and the CPA FY21 Historic Preservation Reserve balance to the project, with the remainder coming from the CPA FY21 General Reserve fund balance.

As you are aware, pursuant to Massachusetts General Law, a public hearing must be scheduled prior to any City Council vote is taken on this order.
